APPLESOX SET TO BATTLE BLUEJACKETS

The Wenatchee AppleSox (6-2, 4-2) square off with the Northwest Honkers (8-7) on Thursday June 12th ...Their one game non-league series follows a series win over Kitsap when the AppleSox mounted bottom of the inning come from behind wins in games two and three....The AppleSox are entering their 15th season (10th in the WCL) and are 469-251 (.651) under skipper Ed Knaggs, who is in his 14th season as head coach of the AppleSox club...The AppleSox have achieved a winning record in all 14 seasons during Knaggs' tenure...Knaggs is assisted by AJ Proszek and Jason Krohn.

WALK OFF WARRIORS

Wednesday, for the second consecutive time, the Wenatchee AppleSox were walk off winners at Paul Thomas Sr. Field. NOTE ABOUT WALK OFF HISTORY FOR APPLESOX.

STEALING YOUR HEART

Taylor Johnson, the AppleSox only catcher on the roster to start the season, delivered the game-winning RBI's in games two and three of the Sox third series on the season. Johnson, who hasn't had a day off since Opening Night, is batting .200, but two of his five hits have come at the best moments for Wenatchee. He becomes the first AppleSox player to generate walk off wins on back-to-back nights.

12 RUNS; NOT ENOUGH

For the first time in AppleSox history, 12 runs wasn't enough to earn a win for the opposition. The 12 runs scored by Kitsap in Wednesday's contest are the most scored against the Sox by an opponent in a loss. The AppleSox gave up 11 runs and won three times previously in franchise history.

TOO CLOSE TO CALL

Of the AppleSox first eight games in 2014, four have been decided by one run. Two were won on the final at bat of the game, both going to the Sox.

ABOUT THE HONKERS

The Northwest Honkers were founded in 2010 and are members of the Pacific International League (the AppleSox were in this league from 2000-04). The PIL is a seven-team league with three from Washington and four from British Columbia. The Honkers record is 8-7 with three wins in their last four games.

SERIES WITH THE HONKERS

This is the first meeting between the AppleSox and the Honkers.

NON LEAGUE, NO PROBLEM

Tonight's game is the third of five non-league outings this season. The Sox enter play Thursday with a 2-0 non-league record in 2014. The AppleSox have done well in these type games sporting a 102-38 record overall (72.9%), are 88-31 (73.9%) at home and have won the last 16 of 17 and 22 of 24.

QUICK TO DEFROST

In his first two nights with the AppleSox club, Tyler Frost left an impact. He was the winning pitcher on Tuesday as Wenatchee came back in the bottom of the ninth to defeat the Kitsap BlueJackets; just hours after Frost arrived in town. Thursday, he saw his first action at the plate when he was called upon as a pinch hitter in the bottom of the eleventh inning of the Sox second straight come from behind win. He singled home the tying run in the ballgame with a hard groundball up the middle. He was pinch hitting for Simon Rosenbaum, who had a solo home run earlier in the game.

LONG GAMES: GOOD TIMES

Four of the first five AppleSox games played at Paul Thomas Sr. Field in 2014 have resulted in wins. The average time of a ballgame at Paul Thomas this season? 3 Hours and 12 Minutes (The all-time average for AppleSox baseball is just a touch over two and a half hours). Following Wednesday's 3 hour and 19 minute marathon, the AppleSox have strung together four consecutive home games totaling 3+ hours a piece. This marks the first time in team history that four consecutive home games have exceeded 3 hours.

THE ROAD TO OMAHA

Out of the 40 players on Wenatchee's preseason roster, 5 entered the NCAA Division I Baseball Tournament with dreams of claiming a National Championship Trophy in Omaha, Neb. Drew Rasmussen and Nate Esposito of Oregon State, along with Shaun Vetovec, John Brontsema and AJ Alcantara of UC Irvine qualified for the NCAA Tournament. UC Irvine defeated Oregon State 4-2 in the final game of the Corvallis Regional. They went on to face Oklahoma State and eventually sweep the Cowboys in Super Regional play (best of three series). OSU and UCI split their first two meetings in the Corvallis Regional, before UCI eliminated them in game three.

"SENIOR" CITIZENS

Ian Buckles, Clark McKittrick, Tom Zarosinski, Nate Esposito, and Mike Livingston are amongst the oldest on the AppleSox roster. These 5 players will be entering their senior seasons of college baseball in 2015. Half of the AppleSox preseason listed players (20) just completed their freshman year of classes.

YOUNG BUCKS

Nine of the AppleSox 40 listed preseason players are entering the WCL straight out of high school. Following the season, they will go on to make their collegiate debuts at Oregon State, UCLA, Gonzaga, the University of San Diego, Nevada and UC Irvine.

MEET THE SOX

#2 Tanner Nishioka - 2014 Third Team All-West region from Pomona Pitzer...turned 14 double plays in 2014...completed his first season as a member of the Pomona-Pitzer Football team, where he is a punter, while sometimes seeing spot duty at wide receiver. Clutch single for insurance run vs. Yakima on 6/7 (pinch runner in the 8th)

#3 Adam Grubb - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 6 games and started one for Wenatchee Valley College...is from Wenatchee and was a 2013 Wenatchee High School graduate...threw 19.1 Innings, compiled a 1-0 record, struck out 13 batters and had a 2.79 ERA in his first season with the Knights...Threw two scoreless innings of relief with 5 strikeouts against SF on 6/5.

#4 Caleb Wood - All-WCC first team selection in 2014...second on the Gonzaga team batting .300...was a perfect 11 for 11 in steal attempts as a freshman in 2013...was named to the All-WCC Freshman team in 2013 and played in 46 games for the Zags that year... also All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2013...four hits and 3 RBI's in first series vs. Yakima.

#5 Michael McCann - McCann was drafted in the 40th round of the 2013 MLB Entry Draft by the Seattle Mariners...a two-time First Team All-League honoree, he batted .360 in 2012 with 10 doubles, 20 runs scored, and 19 runs batted in at Columbia River High School...hit .232 for Seattle U in 2014 over 49 games.

#6 Nick Valaika - Foothill league All-Second Team in 2014 at Hart High School (player of the year candidate entering the year)...brother of former AppleSox player Pat Valaika... has three older brothers who have all played MLB affiliated baseball.

#7 Mike Livingston - Had a 1.000 fielding percentage during his junior season with Cal State Northridge...finished second on the team with a .280 batting average and was the leadoff hitter in most of CSUN's games sophomore year...notched Sox first 2014 RBI with a double on 6/4 vs. San Francisco.

#8 Taylor Johnson - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 16 games with George Fox University and brought in 4 RBIs on 6 hits in 2014...Hit walkoff RBI single in 5-4 win over Kitsap (6/10)

#9 Cooper Elliott - Just completed his redshirt freshman season at Washington State...2012 graduate of Cashmere High School.....the Bulldogs won state during his sophomore and senior years...was First Team All-League as a junior...Second Team All-State as a senior...doubled on 6/4 vs. San Francisco for first WCL hit...First AppleSox home run 6/7 vs. Pippins.

#10 John Brontsema - Played in 32 games for UC Irvine in 2014...had 12 hits...voted team MVP as a senior in high school...named all-city...All-Channel League award winner...high school team captain...hit .391 with 34 hits as a senior.

#12 Hunter Wells - Will join the Gonzaga Bulldogs baseball team for the 2014-15 school year (he will be a sophomore)...Led the Lower Columbia Red Devils in Wins (6)... also led the Red Devils in Strikeouts (63)...3 hitless innings thrown out of 'pen (6/7 vs. Yakima).

#13 Colton Loomis - Pitches for Spokane Falls and is a Cashmere, WA native...was scheduled to play for AppleSox last season before injuring his knee... as a senior at Cashmere High School he was named the 1A/B State Player of the Year by the Washington Baseball Coaches Association after going 10-0 with a 0.67 ERA, 63 IP, 81 K and 13 BB...offensively hit .418 to get Cashmere its second state title in 3 seasons...helped the Bulldogs to a state championship...Pitched 6 innings of one run ball (6/7 vs. Yakima).

MEET THE SOX

#14 Calvin LeBrun - Joining the Sox from Sunnyslope High School in Arizona...sophomore Year of high school he pitched in a State Title Game for Sunnyslope and won it...Went 12-0 that sophomore season with a 1.47 ERA...formerly selected to compete with the USA Baseball 17U developmental team in Cary, N.C...will join his brother, Cory LeBrun in Spokane when he takes the field with Gonzaga next year...worked for 2 innings to kick off 2014 at Yakima (6/8) - allowed two hits, gave up 0 runs and struck out 2.

#15 Evan McMahan - 3-0 in his freshman year with the Nevada Wolf Pack...all-State, all-Southern Nevada, all-Conference and all-Region during his senior year of high school...was team MVP...6-2 over 62.1 innings of work...recorded 81 strikeouts and a 2.25 ERA...Hit .381 at the plate with 20HR and 30RBI.

#16 Clark McKittrick - Making his second appearance in the WCL after seeing limited action for the Victoria HarbourCats in 2013...posted a 4-1 record for Western Oregon University in 2014...had a 5.81 ERA over 40 IP...previously attended Linn-Benton CC.

#17 Kyle Blankenship - Signed to a temporary contract...a 2013 graduate of Wenatchee High School...started all 10 games he played for Wenatchee Valley College in 2014...3-7 over 47.0 innings...struck out 37 and had a 5.17 ERA.

#18 Sam Brown - Redshirted at the University of Arizona in 2013...hit .286 for Gonzaga in 2014 after transferring...played in 55 games, had 196 at bats, 56 hits, 4 doubles, 3 triples and a homerun...23 RBI's.

#19 Griffin Canning - Comes from Santa Margarita High School in Corto de Caza, CA...currently has a 6-3 record with a 1.20 ERA...team was scheduled for a possible two play-off games on June 3rd...Has 15 career high school wins...217.1IP and 193 K.

#20 Brandon Bailey - Pitcher at Gonzaga University...had 3 of the Zags 4 complete games in 2014...missed Senior season with a torn muscle in his forearm - led to Tommy John Surgery...6-6 with a 3.53 ERA at GU in 2014...started all 14 games he appeared in over 94.1 innings...had 54 strikeouts.

#21 Ian Buckles - Pitching for the AppleSox out of George Fox University...played for Klamath Falls in the WCL last summer...was 5-2 with a 3.24 ERA in 12 games with 4 starts for the Gems in 2013...pitched 52.2 innings and struck out 25 while holding opponents to a .256 batting average...6-1 with a 2.50 ERA at George Fox in 2014...Got first win in 6 inning appearance vs. Yakima (6/8)...allowed 6 hits...struck out three.

#22 Nick Brooks - Plays for the Gonzaga Bulldogs...hit his first collegiate homerun in Spokane against the University of Oregon on April 2nd, 2014...Hit .200 for GU in 25 games with 12 hits, 1 homerun and 8 RBI's...doubled home the go-ahead run for Wenatchee in their 3-2 win to take first road series at Yakima (6/8).

#24 Trenton Brooks - Played for the Nevada in 2014...led all Wolf Pack hitters with a .330 average...was named Second Team All-Mountain West Conference...was 3-1 on the mound for Nevada with a 3.86 ERA in 16 games with 5 starts...threw 28 innings and struck out 20...leads AppleSox in hitting with a .455 average coming into their second WCL series...had five hits and 2 RBIs in his first series of the season (Yakima 6/6-6/8). Hit his first AppleSox home run on June 11th to help spur a four run bottom of the 11th, in which the Sox came back to win their league contest with Kitsap...It was a two run shot way out to right field.

MEET THE SOX

#25 Ty Jackson - From Lewis and Clark State College, Jackson was the NAIA West Pitcher of the Week to lead off the month of May...Played at WSU in 2012 and redshirted the 2013 following Tommy John Surgery...was 4-0 on the mound with a 1.59 ERA in 6 games with 5 starts for LCSC...at the plate he also had a .272 batting average with 7 homeruns...Doubled home two in a 5 run ninth on 6/7 at Yakima.

#26 Tyler Frost - Joins the AppleSox after leading Greenway High School to a State Title in 2014...was 11-1 with a 0.29 ERA and started all 12 games he appeared in...threw 7 complete games and struck out 84 batters over 73 innings of work...opposing hitters could only muster a .156 batting average against Frost...secured his first win of 2014 on June 10th in 2.2 innings of work out of the 'pen, surrendering no runs on two hits...Had his first single of the year in his first try on 6/11 vs. Kitsap...It was an RBI up the middle that tied the extra inning contest and he was pinch hitting for a batter that homered earlier in the game.

#27 Jacob Schroeder - Signed to a temporary contract...plays at Washington State...was 0-1 in 2014 for the Cougars...had 8 appearances and toed the rubber for 10.1 innings...struck out 5 batters...is a side-arm pitcher...Threw two scoreless innings on 6/5 in his first appearance of season.

#28 Nathan Hadley - Former closer from Loyola High School...won seven games as a starter in 2014 for the Cubs...had a 1.59 ERA in 13 games...2014 California All-Region first team selection...recorded a no-hitter on April 4, 2014 (15-0 win for Loyola and a 12 strikeout performance for Hadley)...will play for UCLA in 2015.

#29 Drew Rasmussen - Extremely successful pitcher from Mt. Spokane High School...was a 2014 Perfect Game 3rd Team All-American...West All-Region First Team selection...was recruited by UW, WSU, Oregon and Gonzaga, however, he ultimately chose to play for the Oregon State Beavers.

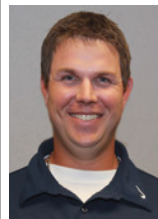

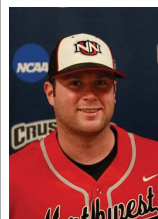
Ed Knaggs #11 Head Coach 14th Season
