

The Wenatchee AppleSox (o-o, o-o WCL East) host San Francisco in a two-game nonleague series, June 4th and 5th at Paul Thomas Sr. Field...game times are 7:05 p.m. Thursday and Friday...The AppleSox are entering their 15th season (10th in the WCL) and are 463-249 (.650) under skipper Ed Knaggs, who is in his 14th season as head coach of the AppleSox club...The AppleSox have achieved a winning record in all 14 seasons during Knaggs' tenure...Knaggs is assisted by AJ Proszek and Jason Krohn.

ABOUT THE SEALS

The San Francisco Seals are an 18+ summer league baseball team from the Bay Area. They were founded in 1987 (included an 18U and 16U team -- both were dropped in 1990). In 1997, after winning the San Diego tournament, the Seals participated in the prestigious National Baseball Congress World Series in Wichita, Kansas, the largest amateur sporting event in the country.

SAN FRANCISCO SERIES NOTES

The AppleSox lead 7-o...series dates back to June 13, 2000 when the AppleSox swept the seals 6-4 and 9-5 in a two game series...since the start of the modern WCL, the AppleSox and Seals have met once (2013)...In the last meeting on August 3, 2013, the AppleSox defeated the Seals 5-3 at Paul Thomas Sr. Field.

NON-LEAGUE, NO PROBLEM

Under Head Coach Ed Knaggs, the AppleSox are 92-37 (.713) in non-league matchups. They have posted a below .500 non-league record only once in the franchise's lifetime (the Sox compiled an 11-12 record in 2003). They have been undefeated in non-league play during Knaggs career twice. Once in 2011 and again in 2012. Overall, the Sox are 100-38 in non-league matchups (.725).

WHERE IT ALL STARTS

The AppleSox have played their season-opener at home 10 times since beginning play in 2000. The Sox are 6-4 in those contests (most recent: W vs. Corvallis in 2013). The Sox are a perfect 4-0 when beginning the season on the road. All of those games came against league opponents. The AppleSox are 4-2 when opening the season against a non-league opponent. (6-2 vs. league opponents). The Seals and AppleSox have never met in a season-opener.

OPENING NIGHT ROSTER

Coach Knaggs has 6 temporary players who are expected to be available to start the season for the AppleSox. Roster changes will occur quite regularly over the first few weeks of the season as players conclude high school/summer classes and their collegiate baseball seasons.

THE ROAD TO OMAHA

Out of the 40 players on Wenatchee's preseason roster, 5 entered the NCAA Division I Baseball Tournament with dreams of claiming a National Championship Trophy in Omaha, Neb. Drew Rasmussen and Nate Esposito of Oregon State, along with Shaun Vetrovec, John Brontsema and AJ Alcantara of UC Irvine qualified for the NCAA Tournament. UC Irvine defeated Oregon State 4-2 in the final game of the Corvallis Regional. They move on to face Oklahoma State in Super Regional play (best of three series). OSU and UCI split their first two meetings in the Corvallis Regional.

"SENIOR" CITIZENS

Ian Buckles, Clark McKitrick, Tom Zarosinski, Nate Esposito, and Mike Livingston are amongst the oldest on the AppleSox roster. These 5 players will be entering their senior seasons of college baseball in 2015. Half of the AppleSox preseason listed players (20) just completed their freshman year of classes.

ATTACK OF THE Mc'S

Four of the AppleSox announced preseason players have names beginning with "Mc." Those atheltes are Chris McDowell, Clark McKitrick, Evan McMahan and Michael McCann

MEET THE SOX

#2 Tanner Nishioka - 2014 Third Team All-West region from Pomona Pitzer...turned 14 double plays in 2014...completed his first season as a member of the Pomona-Pitzer Football team, where he is a punter, while sometimes seeing spot duty at wide receiver.

#3 Adam Grubb - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 6 games and started one for Wenatchee Valley College...is from Wenatchee and was a 2013 Wenatchee High School graduate...threw 19.1 Innings, compiled a 1-0 record, struck out 13 batters and had a 2.79 ERA in his first season with the Knights.

#4 Caleb Wood - All-WCC first team selection in 2014...second on the Gonzaga team batting .300...was a perfect 11 for 11 in steal attempts as a freshman in 2013...was named to the All-WCC Freshman team in 2013 and played in 46 games for the Zags that year... also All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2013.

#5 Michael McCann - McCann was drafted in the 40th round of the 2013 MLB Entry Draft by the Seattle Mariners...a two-time First Team All-League honoree, he batted .360 in 2012 with 10 doubles, 20 runs scored, and 19 runs batted in at Columbia River High School...hit .232 for Seattle U in 2014 over 49 games.

#6 Nick Valaika - Foothill league All-Second Team in 2014 at Hart High School (player of the year candidate entering the year)...brother of former AppleSox player Pat Valaika... has three older brothers who have all played major league affiliated baseball.

#7 Mike Livingston - Had a 1.000 fielding percentage during his junior season with Cal State Northridge...finished second on the team with a .280 batting average and was the leadoff hitter in most of CSUN's games sophomore year.

#8 Taylor Johnson - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 16 games with George Fox University and brought in 4 RBIs on 6 hits in 2014.

#9 Cooper Elliott - Just completed his redshirt freshman season at Washington State...2012 graduate of Cashmere High School...hit over .300 in all four years as a Bulldog and over .400 as a junior and a senior...the Bulldogs won state during his sophomore and senior years...was First Team All-League as a junior...Second Team All-State as a senior.

#10 John Brontsema - Played in 32 games for UC Irvine in 2014...had 12 hits...voted team MVP as a senior in high school...named all-city...All-Channel League award winner...high school team captain...hit .391 with 34 hits as a senior.

#12 Hunter Wells - Will join the Gonzaga Bulldogs baseball team for the 2014-15 school year (he will be a sophomore)...Led the Lower Columbia Red Devils in Wins (6)... also led the Red Devils in Strikeouts (63).

#13 Colton Loomis - Pitches for Spokane Falls and is a Cashmere, WA native...was scheduled to play for AppleSox last season before injuring his knee... as a senior at Cashmere High School he was named the 1A/B State Player of the Year by the Washington Baseball Coaches Association after going 10-0 with a 0.67 ERA, 63 IP, 81 K and 13 BB...offensively hit .418 to get Cashmere its second state title in 3 seasons...helped the Bulldogs to a state championship.

Went 12-0 that sophomore season with a 1.47 ERA...formerly selected to compete with the USA Baseball 17U developmental team in Cary, N.C...will join his brother, Cory LeBrun in Spokane when he takes the field with Gonzaga next year.

#15 Evan McMahan - 3-0 in his freshman year with the Nevada Wolf Pack...all-State, all-Southern Nevada, all-Conference and all-Region during his senior year of high school... was team MVP...6-2 over 62.1 innings of work...recorded 81 strikeouts and a 2.25 ERA... Hit .381 at the plate with 20HR and 30RBI.

#16 Reign Letkeman - Signed to a temporary contract...from Big Bend Community College...4-2 record with a 2.61 record over 12 games with 7 starts, one shutout and two saves...pitched 51.2 innings in 2014 for Big Bend.

#17 Kyle Blankenship - Signed to a temporary contract...a 2013 graduate of Wenatchee High School...started all 10 games he played for Wenatchee Valley College in 2014...3-7 over 47.0 innings...struck out 37 and had a 5.17 ERA.

#18 Sam Brown - Redshirted at the University of Arizona in 2013...hit .286 for Gonzaga in 2014 after transferring...played in 55 games, had 196 at bats, 56 hits, 4 doubles, 3 triples and a homerun...23 RBI's.

#19 Griffin Canning - Comes from Santa Margarita High School in Corto de Caza, CA... currently has a 6-3 record with a 1.20 ERA...team was scheduled for a possible two playoff games on June 3rd...Has 15 career high school wins...217.1IP and 193 K.

#20 Brandon Bailey - Pitcher at Gonzaga University...had 3 of the Zags 4 complete games in 2014...missed Senior season with a torn muscle in his forearm – led to Tommy John Surgery...6-6 with a 3.53 ERA at GU in 2014...started all 14 games he appeared in over 94.1 innings...had 54 strikeouts.

#21 Ian Buckles - Pitching for the AppleSox out of George Fox University...played for Klamath Falls in the WCL last summer...was 5-2 with a 3.24 ERA in 12 games with 4 starts for the Gems in 2013...pitched 52.2 innings and struck out 25 while holding opponents to a .256 batting average...6-1 with a 2.50 ERA at George Fox in 2014.

#22 Nick Brooks - Plays for the Gonzaga Bulldogs...hit his first collegiate homerun in Spokane against the University of Oregon on April 2nd, 2014...Hit .200 for GU in 25 games with 12 hits, 1 homerun and 8 RBI's.

#23 Kaleb Price - Signed to a temporary contract...was 6-1 on the mound for Big Bend Community College...played in 13 games and started 7 while pitching 59.1 innings... struck out 50 batters.

#24 Trenton Brooks - Played for the Nevada in 2014...led all Wolf Pack hitters with a .330 average...was named Second Team All-Mountain West Conference...was 3-1 on the mound for Nevada with a 3.86 ERA in 16 games with 5 starts...threw 28 innings and struck out 20.

#25 Ty Jackson - From Lewis and Clark State College, Jackson was the NAIA West Pitcher of the Week to lead off the month of May...Played at WSU in 2012 and redshirted the 2013 following Tommy John Surgery...was 4-0 on the mound with a 1.59 ERA in 6 games with 5 starts for LCSC...at the plate he also had a .272 batting average with 7 homeruns.

#26 Tyler Frost - Joins the AppleSox after leading Greenway High School to a State Title in 2014...was 11-1 with a 0.29 ERA and started all 12 games he appeared in...threw 7 complete games and struck out 84 batters over 73 innings of work...opposing hitters could only muster a .156 batting average against Frost.

#27 Jacob Schroeder - Signed to a temporary contract...plays at Washington State... was 0-1 in 2014 for the Cougars...had 8 appearances and toed the rubber for 10.1 innings...struck out 5 batters...is a side-arm pitcher.

#28 Jacob Cogar - Plays for Lower Columbia College in the NWACC...was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 2014...appeared in 13 games with 5 starts and had one save...43.2 innings pitched in 2014 with 22 strikeouts...ranked second on the LCC team with 5 wins.

#29 Drew Rasmussen - Extremely successful pitcher from Mt. Spokane High School... was a 2014 Perfect Game 3rd Team All-American...West All-Region First Team selection... was recruited by UW, WSU, Oregon and Gonzaga, however, he ultimately chose to play for the Oregon State Beavers.

#30 Tom Zarosinski - Tom was formerly a redshirt at Oregon State University (2011)... pitched in a WCL non-league game with Corvallis in 2011...was 7-3 with a 1.99 ERA for George Fox University in 2014...struck out 86 batters over 95 innings of play...led George Fox in strikeouts with 86 (next closest was at 67)...one of two George Fox pitchers with and ERA under 2...only GF pitcher with a win and that under 2 ERA...ranked second on the Bruin team in wins.

#32 Simon Rosenbaum - Joining the AppleSox from Pomona Pitzer, Rosenbaum ran wild in DIII in 2014. He was voted First Team All-America by D3baseball.com...was named to the Rawlings DIII First team by American Baseball Coaches Association.... West Region Player of the year...earned Capital One Academic All-District honors from College Sports Information Directors of America...ranked second nationally amongst D3 players with his .474 average...had 8 HR, 23 2B, and 47 RBI ... Led nation in both doubles per game and on base percentage and ranked fifth in slugging percentage.

Ed Knaggs #11 Head Coach 14th Season

Knaggs has been the AppleSox head coach since 2001. He has led the AppleSox to six league championships, winning the Pacific International League Championship in 2003 and the West Coast League Championship in 2005, 2006, 2009, 2010, and 2012. He is a three-time recipient of the WCL's Coach of the Year Award. He played collegiately at UC Irvine and was an assistant coach at Gonzaga University for seven years.
