NAMED HEAD COACH: Sept. 14, 2016

First-year AppleSox head coach Kyle Krustangel has completed two seasons as the skipper of the Yakima Valley CC Yaks. This season, the Yaks finished 33-18 and reached the Super Regional round of the NWAC Chapionships...his top outfielder and current AppleSox player, Cole McKenzie won the NWAC batting title, and an Eastern Region MVP and Gold Glove...in his first year, the Yaks won the NWAC title for the 21st time in school history. The Yaks posted a 34-17 record and also won the NWAC East division with a 20-8 conference record. Last season, Coach Krustangel was named NWAC East coach of the year, NWAC coach of the year, and ABCA Regional coach of the year. Krustangel had eight players sign letter of intents and many more added to four-year rosters from the NWAC title team. Conner Anderson was an ABCA national Gold Glove winner for his defense at first base under Krustangel.

Krustangel took the reigns as Head Coach of the Yaks in 2015. The previous year, he was an assistant coach under Dan Ramsay at Whitworth University. Krustangel was the hitting coach and helped with baseball operations. Whitworth finished with its second-best record in school history, earning an NCAA regional birth in Texas. Whitworth was the NWC tournament champion and had one player sign with the Texas Rangers. Krustangel served as the team's camp and tournament director as well.

From 2011-2014, Krustangel was the head varsity baseball coach at Bridgeport High School. Bridgeport had two playoff appearances under Krustangel and in 2014 Krustangel was voted Coach of the Year.

For the past four summers, Krustangel was the head coach of Spokane Bandits AAA American Legion team. The Bandits won the league championship every year under Krustangel and earned a state tournament berth in each of the last two years. Last summer, the Bandits finished 27 games over .500 and finished third at State.

Krustangel also was the head coach of the Cranbrook Bandits in Cranbrook, BC for two seasons, and was also the associate head coach of the NE 49ers for two seasons. He worked the last seven years as a camp director of the Whitworth NIKE camps and was the lead director last year.

As a player, Krustangel attended Joel E. Ferris High School and was a four-time baseball letter winner and two-time ALL-GSL selection for baseball and football. He played one year at Big Bend CC and transferred to Whitworth University where he was two-time All-NWC. He also played one summer in the WCL for the Spokane Riverhawks.

Krustangel graduated from Whitworth with a Secondary Ed degree with a major in History and minor in ESL. He taught for three years at Bridgeport High School.

Ulrich coached the Spokane Bandits AAA American Legion team last summer, and is a native of Spokane, Wash. He graduated from Eastern Washington University, and was previously the head coach of the Eagles.

He coached at Gonzaga Prep High School for three years and also coached for Prep's summer legion program, before he was named the head coach of the Eastern Washington baseball team.

In the past twenty-six years, Eastern has made the playoffs three times, all three while Cash was the head coach. He coached seven players who earned All-American honors during his four seasons at Cheney, Wash.




