ABOUT THE BLUEJACKETS

The Kitsap BlueJackets are coming off a season-opening sweep against the Klamath Falls Gems at home. Last year, the BlueJackets finished 18-36 and were the 6th place team in the South Division. Kitsap swept one series in all of 2013. The sweep came against the eventual WCL Champions, the Corvallis Knights. It was completed June 28th-30 at Kitsap.

SERIES WITH THE BLUEJACKETS

The AppleSox are 35-16 all-time vs. Kitsap. They are 4-2 in extra inning games. The two squads have never met in the playoffs. Wenatchee holds a 17-game winning streak over Kitsap, which began in 2011.

DONT MESS WITH THE FLOW

The AppleSox have won 17-straight against the Kitsap BlueJackets. The current streak dates back to 2011 (the last time Kitsap defeated Wenatchee). The current streak was extended last season when the Sox won in all 6 meetings with the BlueJackets.

CASHMERE CELEBRATES

AppleSox fans from Cashmere were in the mood to celebrate on Saturday night as their two local players turned in key performances, helping the Sox to a 7-1 win over Yakima Valley. Starter Colton Loomis threw six strong innings and only gave up three hits and one run. He struck out five. Right fielder Cooper Elliott hit the AppleSox first home run of the season (and the first home run at County Stadium in Pippins franchise history). His two run shot came in the ninth inning and pushed across the sixth and seventh runs of the day for the AppleSox.

TEMPORARY PITCHERS STEP UP

In the AppleSox first two games against the San Francisco Seals, the only pitchers to toe the rubber at Paul Thomas Sr. Field were signed to temporary contracts. Reign Letkeman, Kaleb Price, Kyle Blankenship and Adam Grubb are all on the classic temporary contracts, assisting the team until some of their full-time players arrive. Jacob Schroeder, who pitched Thursday, will be leaving the AppleSox in late June to return to Washington State University for summer classes.

THE ROAD TO OMAHA

Out of the 40 players on Wenatchee's preseason roster, 5 entered the NCAA Division I Baseball Tournament with dreams of claiming a National Championship Trophy in Omaha, Neb. Drew Rasmussen and Nate Esposito of Oregon State, along with Shaun Vetrovec, John Brontsema and AJ Alcantara of UC Irvine qualified for the NCAA Tournament. UC Irvine defeated Oregon State 4-2 in the final game of the Corvallis Regional. They went on to face Oklahoma State and eventually sweeo the Cowboys in Super Regional play (best of three series). OSU and UCI split their first two meetings in the Corvallis Regional, before UCI eliminated them in game three.

"SENIOR" CITIZENS

Ian Buckles, Clark McKitrick, Tom Zarosinski, Nate Esposito, and Mike Livingston are amongst the oldest on the AppleSox roster. These 5 players will be entering their senior seasons of college baseball in 2015. Half of the AppleSox preseason listed players (20) just completed their freshman year of classes.

YOUNG BUCKS

Nine of the AppleSox 40 listed preseason players are entering the WCL straight out of high school. Following the season, they will go on to make their collegiate debuts at Oregon State, UCLA, Gonzaga, the University of San Diego, Nevada and UC Irvine.

#2 Tanner Nishioka - 2014 Third Team All-West region from Pomona Pitzer...turned 14 double plays in 2014...completed his first season as a member of the Pomona-Pitzer Football team, where he is a punter, while sometimes seeing spot duty at wide receiver. Clutch single for insurance run vs. Yakima on 6/7 (pinch runner in the 8th -- didn't start due to illness).

#3 Adam Grubb - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 6 games and started one for Wenatchee Valley College...is from Wenatchee and was a 2013 Wenatchee High School graduate...threw 19.1 Innings, compiled a 1-0 record, struck out 13 batters and had a 2.79 ERA in his first season with the Knights...Threw two scoreless innings of relief with 5 strikeouts against SF on 6/5.

#4 Caleb Wood - All-WCC first team selection in 2014...second on the Gonzaga team batting .300...was a perfect 11 for 11 in steal attempts as a freshman in 2013...was named to the All-WCC Freshman team in 2013 and played in 46 games for the Zags that year... also All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2013...four hits and 3 RBI's in first series vs. Yakima 6/6-6/8.

#5 Michael McCann - McCann was drafted in the 40th round of the 2013 MLB Entry Draft by the Seattle Mariners...a two-time First Team All-League honoree, he batted .360 in 2012 with 10 doubles, 20 runs scored, and 19 runs batted in at Columbia River High School...hit .232 for Seattle U in 2014 over 49 games.

#6 Nick Valaika - Foothill league All-Second Team in 2014 at Hart High School (player of the year candidate entering the year)...brother of former AppleSox player Pat Valaika... has three older brothers who have all played major league affiliated baseball.

#7 Mike Livingston - Had a 1.000 fielding percentage during his junior season with Cal State Northridge...finished second on the team with a .280 batting average and was the leadoff hitter in most of CSUN's games sophomore year...notched Sox first 2014 RBI with a double on 6/4 vs. San Francisco.

#8 Taylor Johnson - Signed to a temporary contract...played in 16 games with George Fox University and brought in 4 RBIs on 6 hits in 2014.

#9 Cooper Elliott - Just completed his redshirt freshman season at Washington State...2012 graduate of Cashmere High School.....the Bulldogs won state during his sophomore and senior years...was First Team All-League as a junior...Second Team All-State as a senior...doubled on 6/4 vs. San Francisco for first WCL hit...First AppleSox home run 6/7 vs. Pippins.

#10 John Brontsema - Played in 32 games for UC Irvine in 2014...had 12 hits...voted team MVP as a senior in high school...named all-city...All-Channel League award winner...high school team captain...hit .391 with 34 hits as a senior.

#12 Hunter Wells - Will join the Gonzaga Bulldogs baseball team for the 2014-15 school year (he will be a sophomore)...Led the Lower Columbia Red Devils in Wins (6)... also led the Red Devils in Strikeouts (63)...3 hitless innings thrown out of 'pen (6/7 vs. Yakima).

#13 Colton Loomis - Pitches for Spokane Falls and is a Cashmere, WA native...was scheduled to play for AppleSox last season before injuring his knee... as a senior at Cashmere High School he was named the 1A/B State Player of the Year by the Washington Baseball Coaches Association after going 10-0 with a 0.67 ERA, 63 IP, 81 K and 13 BB...offensively hit .418 to get Cashmere its second state title in 3 seasons...helped the

#15 Evan McMahan - 3-0 in his freshman year with the Nevada Wolf Pack...all-State, all-Southern Nevada, all-Conference and all-Region during his senior year of high school... was team MVP...6-2 over 62.1 innings of work...recorded 81 strikeouts and a 2.25 ERA... Hit .381 at the plate with 20HR and 30RBI.

#19 Griffin Canning - Comes from Santa Margarita High School in Corto de Caza, CA... currently has a 6-3 record with a 1.20 ERA...team was scheduled for a possible two playoff games on June 3rd...Has 15 career high school wins...217.1IP and 193 K.

#20 Brandon Bailey - Pitcher at Gonzaga University...had 3 of the Zags 4 complete games in 2014...missed Senior season with a torn muscle in his forearm — led to Tommy John Surgery...6-6 with a 3.53 ERA at GU in 2014...started all 14 games he appeared in over 94.1 innings...had 54 strikeouts.

#25 Ty Jackson - From Lewis and Clark State College, Jackson was the NAIA West Pitcher of the Week to lead off the month of May...Played at WSU in 2012 and redshirted the 2013 following Tommy John Surgery...was 4-0 on the mound with a 1.59 ERA in 6 games with 5 starts for LCSC...at the plate he also had a .272 batting average with 7 homeruns... Doubled home two in a 5 run ninth on 6/7 at Yakima.

#26 Tyler Frost - Joins the AppleSox after leading Greenway High School to a State Title in 2014...was 11-1 with a 0.29 ERA and started all 12 games he appeared in...threw 7 complete games and struck out 84 batters over 73 innings of work...opposing hitters could only muster a .156 batting average against Frost.

#27 Jacob Schroeder - Signed to a temporary contract...plays at Washington State... was o-1 in 2014 for the Cougars...had 8 appearances and toed the rubber for 10.1 innings...struck out 5 batters...is a side-arm pitcher...Threw two scoreless innings on 6/5 in his first appearance of season.

#28 Jacob Cogar - Plays for Lower Columbia College in the NWACC...was 5-2 with a 2.67 ERA in 2014...appeared in 13 games with 5 starts and had one save...43.2 innings pitched in 2014 with 22 strikeouts...ranked second on the LCC team with 5 wins.

#29 Drew Rasmussen - Extremely successful pitcher from Mt. Spokane High School... was a 2014 Perfect Game 3rd Team All-American...West All-Region First Team selection... was recruited by UW, WSU, Oregon and Gonzaga, however, he ultimately chose to play for the Oregon State Beavers.
