# SOX SWEEP BEARS




- The Sox took both games of a weekend set against the Highline Bears on June 22 and 23.

# **Hammel Hangs Up His Cleats**

After 13 seasons the first former AppleSox player to appear in an MLB game called it quits prior to the start of the 2019 season. Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2002, Jason Hammel tossed 1,810.1 innings and struck out 1,428 batters for six different teams. In 2016, he won the World Series as a member of the Chicago Cubs.

Hammel pitched for the AppleSox in 2001, going 0-1 with a 6.46 ERA in five appearances, three starts. He was a part of an AppleSox squad that made a six-game improvement from their inaugural season.

Volunteer Assistant Coach Former AppleSox utilityman Jacob Prater (2015, 17, 18) will join the AppleSox coaching staff in 2019 as a volunteer assistant. Prater will primarily be with the team at home but will travel with them for some road games. He will assist in both offensive and defensive strategy.

Prater graduated from Seattle U in the spring and slashed .279/.396/.398 as a senior.

In three seasons with the Sox, Prater hit a combined .289 in his AppleSox tenure, including a team-high .359 in 2017 and played every position except CF, P and C

Third season Ulrich is in his third season as an assistant coach with the AppleSox. He has also coached at Yakima Valley College since 2016. Prior to joining the Applesox in 2017, the Eastern Washington University graduate spent the summer of 2016 coaching the Spokane Bandits AAA American Legion team. He is a native of Spokane and spent three years coaching at his alma mater, Gonzaga prep.

First season VonDracek is in his first season as a pitching coach with the AppleSox. This will be VonDracek's second summer coaching in the West Coast League after serving as an assistant pitching coach for the Cowlitz Black Bears last summer. VonDracek has spent the last four season coaching at Yakima Valley College.
