ALL-STAR HOPEFULS



The 12th West Coast League All-Star Game will take place on July 23 at Vince Genna Stadium, the home of the Bend Elks.

Several AppleSox players have put themselves in position to earn an All-Star berth ahead of the mid-summer classic.

Here's just three of several deserving AppleSox All-Stars.

Cole McKenzie



The incoming senior at Purdue leads the AppleSox with a .411 average, 23 hits and five doubles. His batting average is also third in the West Coast League. He has recorded eight multi-hit games. McKenzie enters the weekend with hits in 10 of his last 11 games.

Sam Wyatt



In four appearances of relief, Wyatt has allowed just two earned runs in 14.1 innings. His 14.1 innings-pitched are second most on the team and tops among relievers. Wyatt has tossed at least three innings in three of his four outings and his 17 strikeouts are second-most on the team.

Landon Schirer



In seven relief appearances, Schirer has only allowed one run and hadn't allowed any until his sixth appearance of the season. The right-hander has locked down three saves and struck out 11 batters. Schirer has only allowed four hits in nine innings-pitched.

Clayton Mortensen and **Quinn LeSage** of the Wenatchee AppleSox combined on a no-hitter vs. Kelowna on July 27, 2005 at Elks Stadium. Wenatchee won 11-2. Mortensen pitched 6.1 innings and gave up two earned runs (walked 4, struck out 5). LeSage pitched 2.2 innings.

DJ Lidyard tossed a no-hitter vs. Moses Lake at Larson Playfield on July 19, 2006. Wenatchee won 2-0.

Krustangel was named the fourth coach in AppleSox history on Sept. 14, 2016.

In each of his first two seasons with the AppleSox, Krustangel had the Sox in playoff contention through the final weekend of the season.

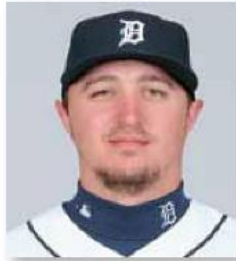
The AppleSox have hit at least 30 home runs in both of Krustangel's two seasons at the helm after failing to match that number in the previous three seasons before his hire.

Hammel Hangs Up His Cleats

After 13 seasons the first former AppleSox player to appear in an MLB game called it quits prior to the start of the 2019 season. Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2002, Jason Hammel tossed 1,810.1 innings and struck out 1,428 batters for six different teams. In 2016, he won the World Series as a member of the Chicago Cubs.

Hammel pitched for the AppleSox in 2001, going 0-1 with a 6.46 ERA in five appearances, three starts. He was a part of an AppleSox squad that made a six-game improvement from their inaugural season.

Canning allowed three runs (all earned) on four hits and one walk while striking out six batters.</p> <p>Canning picked up his first major-league win in his next outing, May 7 on the road against the Detroit Tigers. The right-hander allowed two runs (both earned) on four hits and a walk while striking out seven in 5.1 innings.</p> <p>The Angels selected Canning 47th overall in the 2017 MLB First-Year Player Draft.</p> <p>In 2014, Canning went 1-1 with a 1.61 ERA in five appearances (four starts). In each of his final two starts with the AppleSox, June 3 and 11, Canning tossed six scoreless innings and struck out eight and 10 batters, respectively.</p>	 <p><i>Canning with the Sox in 2014</i></p>
 <p>KESTON HIURA</p>	<p>Keston Hiura became the 13th AppleSox alum to appear in a major-league game when he went 2-for-3 with two singles and a walk while starting at second base against the Philadelphia Phillies.</p> <p>Hiura hit his first major-league home run in his sixth major-league game on May 19 against the Atlanta Braves.</p> <p>Hiura entered the 2019 season as the Milwaukee Brewers' top prospect and the 15th best in MLB. He was drafted ninth overall in the 2017 MLB First-Year Player Draft.</p> <p>In 2015 with the AppleSox, Hiura hit .356 in 41 games while setting team records in doubles (21), triples (6), extra-base hits (33) and total bases (119).</p>	 <p><i>Hiura with the Sox in 2015</i></p>
