ABOUT THE BELLINGHAM BELLS

The Bellingham Bells were founded in 1999. They played in the PIL until joining the WCL in 2005. The Bells finished with a 27-27 record, 2.5 GB of the AppleSox in 2013. During their 2012 playoff season they were 32-22 (a big improvement over their 21-32 2011 campaign). The Bells are winners of four straight and seven of their last nine. They lead the WCL West division by three games.

SERIES WITH THE BELLS

The AppleSox are 35-20 leaders over the Bellingham Bells in all-time series play dating back to 2005. The teams have met in two playoff series. Once in 2005 and for a full three game set in 2012. The AppleSox won both playoff series. The AppleSox lead 4-3 in extra inning contests.

FROM PROMS TO PUTOUTS

The AppleSox had three high school graduate pitchers combine to toss a four-hitter on Sunday. This was the first time in AppleSox history that a group of high school pitchers was able to combine to hold an opponent to four or less hits.

SUNDAY FUN DAY

The AppleSox are now 4-0 on Sunday after their series win over the Corvallis Knights. This is the highest win total on any single day of the week during the 2014 season, for Wenatchee.

ENDING JUNE

The AppleSox have a chance for a 17-8 record to end the month of June. In 2013, the AppleSox ended June, 11-10. In the AppleSox 2012 Championship, they had a eye-popping 17-4 record.

ZAGS PAY OFF

The AppleSox have four players from Gonzaga and two players that are committed to the Bulldogs. Combined, four of these players are hitters and three of the players are pitchers (Tyler Frost pitches and plays the field). The hitters have a combined .327 average, 17 extra base hits, 24 RBIs, 31 BB, and 10 stolen bases. The Pitchers have posted a 1.07 ERA, a 2-1 record in 4 starts with 35.1 innings pitched. They have accumulated 2 saves and only allowed five extra base hits.

FOR THE RECORD

The AppleSox were errorless in the series finale vs. Corvallis. They have placed a zero in the error column three times this season. In all three of those games they secured the win.

TOUGH TO CRACK

The three projected starters in the Bellingham series have held opponents to a combined .230 batting average. They also have a 1.98 ERA on the season. That is especially good considering that the AppleSox average 4.67 runs per game.

IN FOR THE LONG HAUL

The AppleSox are 8-1 in games in which their starting pitchers work for six or more innings. Brandon Bailey is on a limited pitch count following his 2013 Tommy John Surgery and long 2014 season with Gonzaga. He averages 4.03 innings per start. The good news is the AppleSox didn't need to dive into their deep bullpen on Sunday, thanks to the 6.1 innings of one hit baseball turned in by incoming Oregon State freshman Drew Rasmussen.

MEET THE SOX

#1 Joe Gillette - Played football and baseball for the Falcons, however, he shifted his focus entirely to baseball before his junior season of high school...Gillette was named to the 2013 New Balance All-Area Code Games Team and he competed for the L.A. Dodgers scout team in 2012 for Team USA's under-18 squad at Dodger Stadium.

#2 Tanner Nishioka - 2014 Third Team All-West region from Pomona Pitzer...turned 14 double plays in 2014...completed his first season as a member of the Pomona-Pitzer Football team, where he is a punter, while sometimes seeing spot duty at wide receiver. Clutch single for insurance run vs. Yakima on 6/7 (pinch runner in the 8th)

#3 AJ Alcantara - During his RS freshman season, Alcantara ranked first on the UCI team in batting with a .378 average...This total came in just ahead of formal AppleSox power hitter Connor Spencer...He was an All-CIF selection second team choice as a senior in high school.

#4 Caleb Wood - All-WCC first team selection in 2014...second on the Gonzaga team batting .300...was a perfect 11 for 11 in steal attempts as a freshman in 2013...was named to the All-WCC Freshman team in 2013 and played in 46 games for the Zags that year...also All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2013...four hits and 3 RBI's in first series vs. Yakima.

#5 Tyler Frost - Secured his first win of 2014 on June 10th in 2.2 innings of work out of the 'pen, surrendering no runs on two hits...Had his first single of the year in his first try on 6/11 vs. Kitsap...It was an RBI up the middle that tied the extra inning contest and he was pinch hitting for a batter that homered earlier in the game.

#6 Nick Valaika - Foothill league All-Second Team in 2014 at Hart High School (player of the year candidate entering the year)...brother of former AppleSox player Pat Valaika... has three older brothers who have all played MLB affiliated baseball.

#7 Mike Livingston - Had a 1.000 fielding percentage during his junior season with Cal State Northridge...finished second on the team with a .280 batting average and was the leadoff hitter in most of CSUN's games sophomore year...notched Sox first 2014 RBI with a double on 6/4 vs. San Francisco.

#8 Nate Esposito - Esposito is making his second appearance in the WCL after playing for the Corvallis Knights in 2012...Esposito was selected in the 46th round of the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft by Oakland but did not sign...Played in 21 games for Corvallis of the West Coast League ... Batted .232 with one double and 10 RBI ... Compiled a 1.000 fielding percentage.

#9 Cooper Elliott - Just completed his redshirt freshman season at Washington State...2012 graduate of Cashmere High School.....the Bulldogs won state during his sophomore and senior years...was First Team All-League as a junior...Second Team All-State as a senior...doubled on 6/4 vs. San Francisco for first WCL hit...First AppleSox home run 6/7 vs. Pippins.

#10 John Brontsema - Played in 32 games for UC Irvine in 2014...had 12 hits...voted team MVP as a senior in high school...named all-city...All-Channel League award winner...high school team captain...hit .391 with 34 hits as a senior.

#12 Hunter Wells - Will join the Gonzaga Bulldogs baseball team for the 2014-15 school year (he will be a sophomore)...Led the Lower Columbia Red Devils in Wins (6)... also led the Red Devils in Strikeouts (63)...3 hitless innings thrown out of 'pen (6/7 vs. Yakima).

MEET THE SOX

#13 Colton Loomis - Pitches for Spokane Falls and is a Cashmere, WA native...was scheduled to play for AppleSox last season before injuring his knee... as a senior at Cashmere High School he was named the 1A/B State Player of the Year by the Washington Baseball Coaches Association after going 10-0 with a 0.67 ERA, 63 IP, 81 K and 13 BB...offensively hit .418 to get Cashmere its second state title in 3 seasons...helped the Bulldogs to a state championship...Pitched 6 innings of one run ball (6/7 vs. Yakima).

#14 Calvin LeBrun - Joining the Sox from Sunnyslope High School in Arizona...sophomore Year of high school he pitched in a State Title Game for Sunnyslope and won it... Went 12-0 that sophomore season with a 1.47 ERA...formerly selected to compete with the USA Baseball 17U developmental team in Cary, N.C...will join his brother, Cory LeBrun in Spokane when he takes the field with Gonzaga next year...worked for 2 innings to kick off 2014 at Yakima (6/8) - allowed two hits, gave up 0 runs and struck out 2...On 6/17 was tied atop the WCL for lowest ERA (while meeting the minimum requirements for bullpen appearances (0.00)...Gave up first ER on 6/22 in 9th vs. WW.

#15 Evan McMahan - 3-0 in his freshman year with the Nevada Wolf Pack...all-State, all-Southern Nevada, all-Conference and all-Region during his senior year of high school... was team MVP...6-2 over 62.1 innings of work...recorded 81 strikeouts and a 2.25 ERA... Hit .381 at the plate with 20HR and 30RBI.

#16 Clark McKitrick - Making his second appearance in the WCL after seeing limited action for the Victoria HarbourCats in 2013...posted a 4-1 record for Western Oregon University in 2014...had a 5.81 ERA over 40 IP...previously attended Linn-Benton CC.

#17 Evan Cassolato - During his 2014 redshirt freshman season, Cassolato played in 42 games and hit .245 for the Anteaters. Cassolato is a product of Cathedral Catholic High School, the top DIII team in California in 2012.

#18 Sam Brown - Redshirted at the University of Arizona in 2013...hit .286 for Gonzaga in 2014 after transferring...played in 55 games, had 196 at bats, 56 hits, 4 doubles, 3 triples and a homerun...23 RBI's.

#19 Griffin Canning - Comes from Santa Margarita High School in Corto de Caza, CA... currently has a 6-3 record with a 1.20 ERA...team was scheduled for a possible two play-off games on June 3rd...Has 15 career high school wins...217.1IP and 193 K.

#20 Brandon Bailey - Pitcher at Gonzaga University...had 3 of the Zags 4 complete games in 2014...missed Senior season with a torn muscle in his forearm - led to Tommy John Surgery...6-6 with a 3.53 ERA at GU in 2014...started all 14 games he appeared in over 94.1 innings...had 54 strikeouts.

#21 Ian Buckles - Played for Klamath Falls in the WCL last summer...Got first win in 6 inning appearance vs. Yakima (6/8)...allowed 6 hits...struck out three...6IP on 6/15 vs. MED in win...allowed three hits and two runs...7 inning two hit performance on 6/22 vs. WW... first pitcher in WCL to 3-0 record.

#22 Nick Brooks - Plays for the Gonzaga Bulldogs...hit his first collegiate homerun in Spokane against the University of Oregon on April 2nd, 2014...Hit .200 for GU in 25 games with 12 hits, 1 homerun and 8 RBI's...doubled home the go-ahead run for Wenatchee in their 3-2 win to take first road series at Yakima (6/8).

#23 John Pomeroy He allowed one run and one walk in his lone appearance...Hit 98 m.p.h. in his first appearance out of the 'pen 6/19 vs. Klamath Falls.

MEET THE SOX

#24 Trenton Brooks - Leads AppleSox in hitting with a .455 average coming into their second WCL series...had five hits and 2 RBIs in his first series of the season (Yakima 6/6-6/8). Hit his first AppleSox home run on June 11th to help spur a four run bottom of the 11th, in which the Sox came back to win their league contest with Kitsap...It was a two run shot way out to right field...Recorded first save 6/18 at KF.

#25 Ty Jackson - From Lewis and Clark State College, Jackson was the NAIA West Pitcher of the Week to lead off the month of May...Played at WSU in 2012 and redshirted the 2013 following Tommy John Surgery...was 4-0 on the mound with a 1.59 ERA in 6 games with 5 starts for LCSC...at the plate he also had a .272 batting average with 7 homeruns...Doubled home two in a 5 run ninth on 6/7 at Yakima...WCL leader in doubles on 6/21 w/ 7.

#26 Michael McCann - McCann was drafted in the 40th round of the 2013 MLB Entry Draft by the Seattle Mariners...a two-time First Team All-League honoree, he batted .360 in 2012 with 10 doubles, 20 runs scored, and 19 runs batted in at Columbia River High School...hit .232 for Seattle U in 2014 over 49 games...hot start to 2014 WCL season. 4-7 in his first at bats with a 3-4 2 RBI game against Medford 6/15...Bases clearing double on 6/17 vs. KF...another double in the 7th of that contest...played third for the AppleSox in early stages of season.

#28 Nathan Hadley - Former closer from Loyola High School...won seven games as a starter in 2014 for the Cubs...had a 1.59 ERA in 13 games...2014 California All-Region first team selection...recorded a no-hitter on April 4, 2014 (15-0 win for Loyola and a 12 strikeout performance for Hadley)...will play for UCLA in 2015.

#29 Drew Rasmussen - Extremely successful pitcher from Mt. 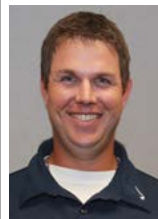
