The Wenatchee AppleSox (25-19, 21-18) travel to Central Oregon to take on the Bend Elks (24-15) in a three game series at Vince Genna Stadium...The series marks the teams' only meeting of the year...The AppleSox are entering their 15th season (10th in the WCL) and are 487-268 (.646) under skipper Ed Knaggs, who is in his 14th season as head coach of the AppleSox club...The AppleSox have achieved a winning record in all 14 seasons during Knaggs' tenure...Knaggs is assisted by AJ Proszek and Jason Krohn.

ABOUT THE BEND ELKS

The Bend Elks are one of the WCL's initial franchises. The AppleSox modern-day WCL series with Bend dates back to 2005. The Elks play at Vince Genna Stadium and are in the WCL South Division.

SERIES WITH THE ELKS

The Elks currently stand one game out of first place in the WCL South and are leading the WCL Wildcard standings by three games over the AppleSox. Coming into 2014, Bend was the only WCL club to hold an overall winning record against the AppleSox. They are 25-24 leaders in the series over the AppleSox in WCL play. The clubs have met in the playoffs once in 2010 and it was the championship series. The series took three games and the AppleSox won the 2010 WCL crown (W-L-W). The teams have met in extra innings three times, with Bend winning two of the three (2008 twice, AppleSox won in 2005). Last season the AppleSox were swept in their only three meetings with Bend (at Vince Genna Stadium).

TWO HOTTEST TEAMS IN WCL

The AppleSox and the Elks are currently the two hottest teams in the WCL. Bend has won five straight and the AppleSox have won five of their last six. The stage is set for a great meeting between two wildcard teams who could easily become division-leaders.

BUCKLES LOOKING FOR W

After starting 3-0, Ian Buckles is once again looking for a winning decision. He is now 3-2, with his most recent start being a no-decision.

DEFENSE

After last night's contest, the AppleSox have now posted errorless games seven times in 2014. In these seven games, the AppleSox are 5-2.

APPLESOX LOSE CANNING; WOOD SIDELINED

More bad news for the AppleSox on the injury front. Griffin Canning has been lost for the summer, due to arm soreness and Caleb Wood has some lingering knee pain that will (at a minimum) keep him out of the weekend series with Bend. Wood is the second leading hitter in the WCL and Canning has been one of the AppleSox most prolific high school pitchers.

VANDERKIN BACK

Kyle Vanderkin, a recent addition to the AppleSox, rejoins the AppleSox in Bend. He has missed some games on and off as he prepares to make a transfer to Gonzaga in the fall.

NEW YEAR; NO CARRY OVER

The AppleSox can forget all about last season's series with Bend. In the WCL, what happened a year ago often means nothing, which is a good thing for Wenatchee when you consider that the Elks swept the AppleSox at Vince Genna Stadium in three games a year ago.

JACKSON STAYING HOT

Ty Jackson homered for the AppleSox last night and continues his stretch of recent success. Jackson has hit safely in seven of his last nine games. Five of those games have been multi-hit games for the AppleSox designated hitter, and two of those five have been of the three-hit variety. Jackson also has tallied all three of his 2014 home runs over that time period.

MEET THE SOX

#1 Joe Gillette - Played football and baseball for the Falcons, however, he shifted his focus entirely to baseball before his junior season of high school...Gillette was named to the 2013 New Balance All-Area Code Games Team and he competed for the L.A. Dodgers scout team in 2012 for Team USA's under-18 squad at Dodger Stadium.

#3 AJ Alcantara - During his RS freshman season, Alcantara ranked first on the UCI team in batting with a .378 average...This total came in just ahead of formal AppleSox power hitter Connor Spencer...He was an All-CIF selection second team choice as a senior in high school.

#4 Caleb Wood - All-WCC first team selection in 2014...second on the Gonzaga team batting .300...was a perfect 11 for 11 in steal attempts as a freshman in 2013...was named to the All-WCC Freshman team in 2013 and played in 46 games for the Zags that year...also All-WCC Honorable Mention in 2013...four hits and 3 RBI's in first series vs. Yakima.

#5 Tyler Frost - Secured his first win of 2014 on June 10th in 2.2 innings of work out of the 'pen, surrendering no runs on two hits...Had his first single of the year in his first try on 6/11 vs. Kitsap...It was an RBI up the middle that tied the extra inning contest and he was pinch hitting for a batter that homered earlier in the game.

#6 Kyle Vanderkin - Vanderkin is from Clark CC and will be headed to Gonzaga for the 2014-15 school year and 2015 baseball season. Vanderkin was a .252 hitter in 2014 for the Clark CC Penguins and was the team's fifth leading hitter. He had 4 doubles, a triple, and 14 RBIs. He stole 11 bases and was caught stealing 4 times.

#7 Mike Livingston - Had a 1.000 fielding percentage during his junior season with Cal State Northridge...finished second on the team with a .280 batting average and was the leadoff hitter in most of CSUN's games sophomore year...notched Sox first 2014 RBI with a double on 6/4 vs. San Francisco.

#8 Nate Esposito - Esposito is making his second appearance in the WCL after playing for the Corvallis Knights in 2012...Esposito was selected in the 46th round of the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft by Oakland but did not sign...Played in 21 games for Corvallis of the West Coast League ... Batted .232 with one double and 10 RBI ... Compiled a 1.000 fielding percentage.

#9 Cooper Elliott - Just completed his redshirt freshman season at Washington State...2012 graduate of Cashmere High School.....the Bulldogs won state during his sophomore and senior years...was First Team All-League as a junior...Second Team All-State as a senior...doubled on 6/4 vs. San Francisco for first WCL hit...First AppleSox home run 6/7 vs. Pippins.

#10 John Brontsema - Played in 32 games for UC Irvine in 2014...had 12 hits...voted team MVP as a senior in high school...named all-city...All-Channel League award winner...high school team captain...hit .391 with 34 hits as a senior.

#12 Hunter Wells - Will join the Gonzaga Bulldogs baseball team for the 2014-15 school year (he will be a sophomore)...Led the Lower Columbia Red Devils in Wins (6)... also led the Red Devils in Strikeouts (63)...3 hitless innings thrown out of 'pen (6/7 vs. Yakima).

MEET THE SOX

#13 Colton Loomis - Pitches for Spokane Falls and is a Cashmere, WA native...was scheduled to play for AppleSox last season before injuring his knee... as a senior at Cashmere High School he was named the 1A/B State Player of the Year by the Washington Baseball Coaches Association after going 10-0 with a 0.67 ERA, 63 IP, 81 K and 13 BB...offensively hit .418 to get Cashmere its second state title in 3 seasons...helped the Bulldogs to a state championship...Pitched 6 innings of one run ball (6/7 vs. Yakima).

#14 Calvin LeBrun - Joining the Sox from Sunnyslope High School in Arizona...sophomore Year of high school he pitched in a State Title Game for Sunnyslope and won it... Went 12-0 that sophomore season with a 1.47 ERA...formerly selected to compete with the USA Baseball 17U developmental team in Cary, N.C...will join his brother, Cory LeBrun in Spokane when he takes the field with Gonzaga next year...worked for 2 innings to kick off 2014 at Yakima (6/8) - allowed two hits, gave up 0 runs and struck out 2...On 6/17 was tied atop the WCL for lowest ERA (while meeting the minimum requirements for bullpen appearances (0.00)...Gave up first ER on 6/22 in 9th vs. WW.

#15 Cole Krueter - Joined the AppleSox on July 7th after being released by the Victoria HarbourCats. Was batting .250 (8-32) with four runs, one double, two RBIs and 5 walks in 13 games as a HarbourCat. Will be headed to UC Irvine next season where he will play for his grandfather, Mike Gillespie. His father, Chad, was a major league catcher and former baseball coach at USC. From Miami, FL and said to have a good baseball I.Q.

#16 Clark McKittrick - Making his second appearance in the WCL after seeing limited action for the Victoria HarbourCats in 2013...posted a 4-1 record for Western Oregon University in 2014...had a 5.81 ERA over 40 IP...previously attended Linn-Benton CC.

#17 Evan Cassolato - During his 2014 redshirt freshman season, Cassolato played in 42 games and hit .245 for the Anteaters. Cassolato is a product of Cathedral Catholic High School, the top DIII team in California in 2012.

#18 Sam Brown - Redshirted at the University of Arizona in 2013...hit .286 for Gonzaga in 2014 after transferring...played in 55 games, had 196 at bats, 56 hits, 4 doubles, 3 triples and a homerun...23 RBI's.

#19 Griffin Canning - Comes from Santa Margarita High School in Corto de Caza, CA... currently has a 6-3 record with a 1.20 ERA...team was scheduled for a possible two play-off games on June 3rd...Has 15 career high school wins...217.1IP and 193 K.

#20 Brandon Bailey - Pitcher at Gonzaga University...had 3 of the Zags 4 complete games in 2014...missed Senior season with a torn muscle in his forearm - led to Tommy John Surgery...6-6 with a 3.53 ERA at GU in 2014...started all 14 games he appeared in over 94.1 innings...had 54 strikeouts.

#21 Ian Buckles - Played for Klamath Falls in the WCL last summer...Got first win in 6 inning appearance vs. Yakima (6/8)...allowed 6 hits...struck out three...6IP on 6/15 vs. MED in win...allowed three hits and two runs...7 inning two hit performance on 6/22 vs. WW... first pitcher in WCL to 3-0 record.

#22 Nick Brooks - Plays for the Gonzaga Bulldogs...hit his first collegiate homerun in Spokane against the University of Oregon on April 2nd, 2014...Hit .200 for GU in 25 games with 12 hits, 1 homerun and 8 RBI's...first WCL HR - solo (7/15 at Walla Walla).

#23 John Pomeroy He allowed one run and one walk in his lone appearance...Hit 98 m.p.h. in his first appearance out of the 'pen 6/19 vs. Klamath Falls.

MEET THE SOX

#24 Trenton Brooks - Leads AppleSox in hitting with a .455 average coming into their second WCL series...had five hits and 2 RBIs in his first series of the season (Yakima 6/6-6/8). Hit his first AppleSox home run on June 11th to help spur a four run bottom of the 11th, in which the Sox came back to win their league contest with Kitsap...It was a two run shot way out to right field...Recorded first save 6/18 at KF.

#25 Ty Jackson - From Lewis and Clark State College, Jackson was the NAIA West Pitcher of the Week to lead off the month of May...Played at WSU in 2012 and redshirted the 2013 following Tommy John Surgery...was 4-0 on the mound with a 1.59 ERA in 6 games with 5 starts for LCSC...at the plate he also had a .272 batting average with 7 homeruns...Doubled home two in a 5 run ninth on 6/7 at Yakima...WCL leader in doubles on 6/21 w/ 7. First WCL Home Run (7/14 - 2 run go-ahead at Walla Walla).

#26 Michael McCann - McCann was drafted in the 40th round of the 2013 MLB Entry Draft by the Seattle Mariners...a two-time First Team All-League honoree, he batted .360 in 2012 with 10 doubles, 20 runs scored, and 19 runs batted in at Columbia River High School...hit .232 for Seattle U in 2014 over 49 games...hot start to 2014 WCL season. 4-7 in his first at bats with a 3-4 2 RBI game against Medford 6/15...Bases clearing double on 6/17 vs. KF...another double in the 7th of that contest...played third for the AppleSox in early stages of season.

#28 Nathan Hadley - Former closer from Loyola High School...won seven games as a starter in 2014 for the Cubs...had a 1.59 ERA in 13 games...2014 California All-Region first team selection...recorded a no-hitter on April 4, 2014 (15-0 win for Loyola and a 12 strikeout performance for Hadley)...will play for UCLA in 2015.

#29 Drew Rasmussen - Extremely successful pitcher from Mt. Spokane High School...was a 2014 Perfect Game 3rd Team All-American...West All-Region First Team selection...was recruited by UW, WSU, Oregon and Gonzaga, however, he ultimately chose to play for the Oregon State Beavers...tallied his first start on 6/16 in a loss to Medford...carried a no-hitter through six and a third innings on 6/29 against Corvallis.
